

Secondary school transfer 2024 – national offer day

Parents who applied for a Secondary School place for their child for September 2024, will receive the result of their application by email during the evening of Friday 1 March 2024 - tonight

What to do if your child does not get offered a place at any of the schools you apply for?

Unfortunately not every child can be offered a place at the school they have applied for. In these cases Lewisham have a duty to ensure that every resident child has been offered a school place.

If your child did not qualify for a place at a school you applied for, they will get offered a place at the closest school to your home address where a place is available. The headteacher of that school will write to welcome your child and invite you to visit the school before you decide whether to accept the offer. Accepting Lewisham's alternative offer secures a secondary school place for your child and does not affect any waiting list your child's name is added to or an admissions appeal. Your child's name will automatically be placed on the waiting list for all of the schools you originally applied for. Waiting list positions can move up or down between 1 March and the start of the school term in September 2024 so there is still a possibility that your child may be offered a place at one of your preferred schools as the school year progresses.

If you want to accept the place you have been offered

If you applied on time, visit the eAdmissions website to accept the place you have been offered. You will need to log into your eAdmissions account using the same user name and password you used to make your original application. If you applied via another method, you will need to follow the instructions in your letter to accept the place. You must accept your place by **Friday 15th March 2024**.

What to do if you have been offered a place at a school you applied for but want to be considered for a higher preference school

We would advise that you initially accept the school place you have been offered. Your child's name will automatically be placed on the waiting list for all higher preference schools than the school your child has been offered.

Radish's plan for this fun Veg Power day is as follows:


•The Radish Big Chomp Salad Bar

Governing Body



Right Respecting Article Of The Week

•**Article 17 (access to information from the media)** - Every child has the right to reliable information from a variety of sources, and governments should encourage the media to provide information that children can understand. Governments must help protect children from materials that could harm them.

•**Article 29 (goals of education)** - Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full. It must encourage the child's respect for human rights, as well as respect for their parents, their own and other cultures and the environment.

•**Article 31 (leisure, play and culture)** - Every child has the right to relax, play and take part in a wide range of cultural and artistic activities.


