Summer-time clothing

We've certainly had some fantastic weather this week. Who knows what will happen next ... ? Please ensure that children come to school in appropriate clothing for the constantly changing weather as we head in to the summer.



We ask that: shoulders are covered; a sunhat is provided; sun cream is applied before school and that shoes are worn with socks. Shoes should fit well, holding the foot securely to avoid a child tripping up. Shorts should be appropriate for school, they should

not be skimpy and should be worn with leggings or be of a reasonable length.

We take advice from Public Health England on keeping children safe in the sun:

- Apply sunscreen (at least 15 with UVA protection) before school every day
- Wear a sunhat - wide-brimmed is best – to avoid sunburn
- Wear loose, light coloured clothing that covers vulnerable areas such as the shoulders

Please note that school staff are not allowed to apply suncreams to children for safeguarding reasons. We don't know the creams your child may be allergic to and we don't want to ask staff to rub cream onto children's bodies. If you have a concern about your child's skin in the sun during the day please let us know via the school office. Thank you everyone.



Punctuality ...

It is very important that your child arrives on time each day. When they arrive late, they walk in to a classroom where children are already

learning, they miss the introduction to the session and it means the day is unsettled for them from the very start.

Our school day begins at 09:15, the gate closes at 09:20. If you arrive with your child after that time you **MUST** report to the school office and, as agreed in our protocol, sign your child in with our admin team there and complete the 'late arrivals' slip. By this time classroom doors are closed, learning has begun, please do not send your child round to their classroom.

Similarly, at the end of the day, if you are late collecting your child, please go to the office to meet them and complete the 'late collection slip'. Many thanks for your support with this.

And ...

Thank you to our many parents and carers who walk to school and to those who park safely on or around our local streets – it is much appreciated. We have, however, had a number of complaints about people double parking to drop their children, blocking the road, blocking the carpark opposite the school and making it unsafe for families and our Year 6 children when crossing the road outside school. There is space to park in Wantage Road or other neighbouring roads. Many thanks.
