Rights Respecting focus... Article 2 (non-discrimination)

This week in assembly we spoke about the importance of International Women's Day. We spoke to the children about the importance of equality of opportunity. The Convention states that every child without discrimination, whatever their ethnicity, sex, religion, language, abilities or any other status, whatever they think or say, whatever their family background should be given equal opportunity and rights.

Our rights respecting team under the guidance of Ms Hearne meet every week to prepare resources and generate ideas to support all our children in class with the Rights Respecting agenda at Brindishe Lee.

It was also pleasing to read some of the wonderful work taking place in Ms Rathbone's year 4 class, where the children are rewriting in children's speak the UN convention on the rights of the child.

WhatsApp

The minimum age rating for a child to use WhatsApp is 16.

The group chat function allows up to 256 people to chat in one conversation stream. Each group is set up by one person, known as the **group admin**, who is the only person who can add or remove participants and change or add further group administrators. Anybody in the group, even if they're not one of your child's phone contacts, will be able to see

messages that your child posts and likewise your child will be able to see theirs. Also, if your child is added to a group with someone they have themselves blocked, that person will then be able to contact them.

Although your child might not be able to control if they're added to a group chat, they can always control their own participation within it - they can leave whenever they want to. Enter the chat. Click on the group's name. Scroll down and press EXIT GROUP. Speak to Ms Lea if you'd like any support doing this.

Please can I urge parents to take note of Ms Lea's very important advice. There are still too many older children at Brindishe Lee using WhatsApp. Please be vigilant and keep an eye on what your child is accessing via computer or a mobile device.
