Report on School Performance Dec 2014



### Achievement

Nationally, all children are tested in Reading, Writing and Maths at age 11 during their last year at primary school.

Here's how many of our children reach the nationally expected level (Level 4b+) in all three subjects:

BG	90%	Compared to the national figure of 67%
BL	97%	
BM	91%	

Here's how many of our children exceed or do better than the nationally expected level (Level 5+) in all three subjects:

BG	45%	Compared to the national figure of 24%
BL	57%

### Progress

Children in Brindishe Schools make excellent progress in Reading, Writing and Maths.

Here's how many of our children made the expected rate of progress in each subject:

### Attendance

The national average for attendance in the latest figures available (2013 to 2014) was 95.3%. In all three schools, our children's attendance was higher than the national.

Brindishe Green – 96.6%  
 Brindishe Lee – 97.7%  
 Brindishe Manor – 96.7%

### Value - Added

Ofsted measures the 'value-added' by schools (the difference a school can make to a child's progress between the age of 7 and 11).

This is measured in percentile ranking. This means if there were 100 schools, how many would do as well as our school and how many would do better or worse.

Here are the rankings for Brindishe Schools:

**Brindishe Green** – Ranking – 1

(A child would make more progress in this school than in 99/100 other schools)

**Brindishe Manor** – Ranking – 1

(A child would make more progress in this school than in 99/100 other schools)

**Brindishe Lee** – Ranking – 4

(A child would make more progress in this school than in 96/100 other schools)

### Academic achievement is important but there's so much more to celebrate at our schools...

- ◆ All three Brindishe Schools hold ArtsMark Gold, nationally recognising our commitment to and provision for the arts (art, dance, music and drama)
- ◆ Brindishe children made nearly 300 visits to theatres, concerts, galleries, museums, places of worship, exhibitions, places of historical and cultural interest such as the Dome and the Tower of London, the seaside, woodlands, parks and city farms in and around London in the last school year
- ◆ Brindishe children danced at Catford Broadway theatre, sang at the Royal Albert Hall, visited Buckingham Palace, explored the work of Matisse, met the Mayor of Lewisham, took part in the Thames Festival, they sailed along the river, travelled by train and tube, learned to ride their bikes safely, spent a week on the Isle of Wight and performed in a rock band
- ◆ Brindishe children played hockey, tag rugby, 'high-fives' netball, cricket, curling, football, basketball and more. They swam, learnt yoga, Zumba, Capoeira and gymnastics. They explored zip wire, archery, fencing and contemporary dance.
