Winter Weather - Coats and Hands

Please can we remind you to make sure that your child brings a warm coat to school, and perhaps a hat, scarf and gloves for the end of the day and lunchtime. Please make sure these are clearly labelled with your child's name. Also, we are still making sure that the children wash their hands several times a day in school as part of keeping everyone safe and well. As the weather has turned colder, please can we suggest that you moisturize your child's hands before they come to school and when they get home as well. This will help to prevent them getting dry and sore. Thank you for your support with this matter.

Cost-of-living support

We know everyone is feeling the pinch this winter and we want to support those families in our school community who are impacted the most. If you're struggling with your finances, please do get in touch to let us know, as there may be things we can suggest which will help. We want to do everything we can to help you and your child through this difficult winter.

Get free or low-cost food

If you're worried about not having enough food to feed your family, you're not alone. There are a number of places offering support.

- If you have a child under 4, and meet the eligibility criteria, you may be entitled to healthy start food vouchers
- Find a local foodbank with these websites: <u>Bankuet</u>, <u>The Independent Food Aid Network</u>, the <u>Trussell</u> Trust, or your local community fridge
- Use food waste apps and websites like <u>Olio</u> (for free food and household items from your local community), <u>Too Good To Go</u> (for low cost food from local restaurants), or <u>Low Price Foods</u> (food that has passed its best before date, but is still safe to consume)

Rights Respecting at Brindishe Schools - Article of the Week

Article 4 (implementation of the Convention)

Governments must do all they can to make sure every child can enjoy their rights by creating systems and passing laws that promote and protect children's rights.

Article 41 (respect for higher national standards)

If a country has laws and standards that go further than the present Convention, then the country must keep these laws.

Human Rights Day

On 10th December 1948, the Universal Declaration of Human Rights was adopted by the United Nations General Assembly.

This important moment in human history is now remembered on that date every year and is known as Human Rights Day.

All children have the same human rights as adults. The UN Convention on the Rights of the Child sets out the additional rights that all children have until the age of 18.

Children's rights are human rights so we can celebrate them alongside the Universal Declaration of Human

Rights.

Pop-ups and adverts

When your child is playing on certain games or is on social media, they may see adverts/ pop up adverts. The content in these adverts may not always be appropriate to them, particularly if clicked on.

It is important to talk to your child about adverts and to think about what they are clicking on before they do and if they are unsure to either ignore them or to check with a trusted adult.
