Cycling to School - Reminder

We realise that cycling has a positive impact on pupil's well-being and Brindishe Lee supports any child wishing to use a bicycle as their preferred means of transport to and from school.

The prime responsibility for transporting pupils to and from school and deciding whether their child is competent to ride the bicycle rests with parents/carers.

To support the Brindishe community further, when children are in Year 5, they have the opportunity to take part in a free Bikeability course which covers may areas including road safety.

The school provides an area where pupils should lock their bikes during the day but we cannot accept liability for loss or damage to the bicycle whilst it is on the school premises or for any accident or injury occurring while the pupil is riding the bicycle. Parents/carers are advised to take out appropriate insurance cover as the school carries no insurance cover for this.

Pupils and parents must adhere to the following rules before their child/ren cycles to school:

- Under no circumstances must pupils ride their bike on school premises.
- Pupils must wear an approved safety helmet at all times when riding their bicycle.
- Bicycles must be in a good, safe, working order and must be fitted with working brakes.
- When cycling in poor light, front and rear lights must be fitted and working properly.
- All bicycles and helmets are to be stored in the bike racks provided on the yard. They must be secured with an appropriate bicycle lock supplied by pupils/parents.
- Pupils must not access the bicycles during the school day.

<u>ROBLOX</u>

PEGI rating PEGI have announced a change to the age rating for Roblox. PEGI used to rate Roblox as 7+, however because of the huge level of user generated content within Roblox, PEGI have changed the rating to a Parental Guidance label.

As a lot of the content is user generated, it may **mean not all games will be suitable for your child to view/play.** It is important to **set up Parental controls appropriate to your child**.

Allowed Experiences – NEW

Roblox has introduced Allowed Experiences, which allows you to select age appropriate experiences, so your child can only join experiences that match their age set. Please note that experiences above the age restriction set may be seen in search results. Age categories available are 9+, 13+ and all ages.

What should I be aware of?

Chat Facility - Players can chat to each other on Roblox. You can add parental controls to turn this feature off completely or add restrictions.

Virtual Currency - Players can buy Robux (their virtual currency) to buy in game upgrades or accessories. If you do not want your child to purchase them, then ensure you set the Monthly Spend Restriction to zero.

Game content – as mentioned, games are created by different users so sometimes the content may not be appropriate for your child.

Blocking users and reporting – ensure your child knows how to do this.

Rights Respecting at Brindishe Schools - Article of the Week

Article 2: The Convention applies to every child without discrimination, whatever their ethnicity, gender, religion, language, abilities or any other status, whatever they think or say, whatever their family background.

Article 23: A child with a disability has the right to live a full and decent life with dignity and, as far as possible, independence and to play an active part in the community. Governments must do all they can to support disabled children and their families.

This week, all children in Brindishe Schools have been reflecting on discrimination in our schools with a focus on anti-bullying. Children from all year groups have discussed what bullying looks like and how we can work together to prevent it and stop it in our schools (if necessary). We are very lucky that children in Brindishe Schools welcome all children from all backgrounds and with all social circumstances. We know how to REPORT. As part of our 'Promoting Good Relationships' Policy we encourage our staff and children to value everyone.

'International Day of People with Disabilities' is an annual global event that promotes equality for people with disability and celebrates their achievements. It has been celebrated every year since 1981. It is also a day to promote awareness of the challenges faced by over 1 billion people living with disabilities, and the role communities and societies play in breaking down barriers to inclusion.
