Request for Leave of Absence for Exceptional Circumstances during Term Time

Parents/carers are requested **not to take their child/ren out of school during term time** as this causes disruption to their education. Children only attend school 190 days a year.

At Brindishe Schools we must follow the law^{*} in this regard and may only grant leave in exceptional circumstances if certain criteria are fulfilled.

Parents/carers should not normally take their child(ren) out of school during the school term.

Leave of absence in exceptional circumstances (such as religious observance or the death of a very close relative) is authorised at the discretion of the Headteacher (it is not the automatic right of parents/carers). Please do not book your leave of absence until you have received the permission of the Headteacher.

Each request for leave of absence will be considered individually, taking into account:

- $\ensuremath{\emptyset}$ the circumstances for the request
- Ø the supporting evidence provided
- Ø the overall attendance of your child(ren)
- Ø your child(ren)'s stage of education, progress and attainment

If the absence is approved by the Headteacher, you will be advised as to how many days the Headteacher has approved for your child(ren)'s absence.

If the school does not agree the absence and you take the leave without permission, or your child is absent for more than the agreed number of days the absence will be **unauthorised**.

You should be aware that a pattern of unauthorised absence is very likely to result in a Penalty Notice, which carries a fine of £120 per parent (for each child), reduced to £60 if paid within 21 days. In the event that this is not paid, the Education Authority may institute court action, which on conviction could result in a fine of up to £2,500 and a criminal conviction.

School lunch and music payments

Thank you for all families that are up to date with lunch and music payments.We ask that any payments for school lunches and music lessons are paid in advance. As a federation, at each school we do all we can to work towards a clear policy of zero tolerance to debts.

You can check if you have any monies owing to the school by logging into your Horizons parent portal. Payment can be made directly through the portal:

- Payments Make payments for specific trips, clubs, music lessons or items and see your payment history.
- School Shop Make top up payments for school meals which is £2.51 per day.

If you do owe any money please make any outstanding payments, the office team will be in touch with those currently owing. If you are unsure of your debt and cannot log in to the portal please contact the school office

Rights Respecting at Brindishe Schools – Article of the week

Article 39 (recovery from trauma and reintegration)

Children who have experienced neglect, abuse, exploitation, torture or who are victims of war must receive special support to help them recover their health, dignity, self-respect and social life.

What support do you think a child who has experienced trauma would need to recover?

- Space and time to talk to someone they trust
- Counselling from a professional
- A safe place to live
- Time to relax and play
- People around them who they love and trust
- Support to develop friendships
- Medical treatment if needed
- Extra support at school
- To understand they have the right to be treated with dignity

At Brindishe Schools, we give children the opportunity to speak to one another and adults about anything that is troubling them. Our support systems in school are robust and include ELSAs (Emotional Literacy Support Assistants) and Designated Safe Guarding Leads.

Watch this video of the book <u>The Journey by Francesca Sanna</u> with your child at home about a family fleeing war - what difficult things does the family experience? When they finally arrive in a safe place, what will they



need in order to 'begin their story again'?

Being unkind online

It can be very easy online for children to behave in a way that they wouldn't if they were face to face with each other.

Talk to your child about how they speak to others online and encourage them to talk to people online with respect and kindness, like they would if they were face-to-face. How they act online should be how they behave on the school playground when they are following school rules. Here are some examples of what being unkind looks like online:

What should I do if my child is being bullied online?

Ensure that your child understands that if they receive unkind messages or see something that worries them, they should not reply or engage in conversation with the perpetrator. Instead, they should tell a trusted adult. You can use the tools within an app to report any offensive or hurtful content as well as block people so they cannot contact you again in the future.
