# Holiday and Food Programme & Vouchers

# **Right Respecting**

As the term ends for Brindishe School, we felt this was a good time to focus on safety in the holiday.

**Article 15 - Freedom of Association -** Every child has the right to meet with other children and to join groups and organisations, as long as this does not stop other people from enjoying their rights. Article 15 is about the right of association which is having the opportunity to gather with others for different purposes.

# Why is important that young people should have the opportunity to meet, spend time together and share ideas?

Joining groups or organisations can help us learn more about different issues.

•Meeting others helps us develop new skills: how to resolve issues, find ways to compromise, share, encourage, show support and empathy.

·It helps us to learn from and mix with a range of other people.

We can learn a lot from other children and young people that helps to form our views and opinions about different things.

·By being with other people, we learn more about ourselves.

•People can be stronger together.

Joining together as a group, we can bring about change.

•Young people have a right to participate and to be listened to and be heard.

The Article 15 project supports children and youth around the world to self-organise and fulfil their rights. Take a look at their website to see how the CRC and Article 15 work to support children and adults in Nepal.
