Mayors Universal Free School Meals Expansion.

As you are aware, from September all pupils will be able to receive a school meal at no cost to their parent/carer. This is known as The Mayors Universal Free School Expansion and is a government initiative.

As this is very new, we have allocated a 3-week trial period for all children in Key Stage 2 who may wish to transfer from packed lunch to school meals. During the first 3 weeks of term, your child/children can try the school meals (free of charge) provided by Radish and teachers will take a daily 'lunch register' during this time. At the end of the 3 weeks, we ask that parents/carers and children make a definite decision as to whether they would like to continue with school meals free of charge or return to a packed lunch option. Rights Respecting Article Of The Week


Article 12 - respect for the views of the child

Every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously. This right applies at all times, for example during immigration proceedings, housing decisions or the child's day-to-day home life.

Why should you be able to share your views and opinions on matters that affect you?

At Brindishe Schools, we believe that Pupil Voice is invaluable. Across our schools we have teams made up of children from all year groups who are able to discuss important issues and make decisions about the school e.g. Rights Respecting Team, School Parliament and Digital Warriors.
