

Child Flu Immunisations

Last week we posted onto Weduc a letter and information on child flu immunisation. Lewisham NHS is now inviting parents/carers to register their consent for their child so that a healthcare team can vaccinate them in school. The vaccination is free and in most cases is a quick and simple spray up the nose. Please copy and paste this into your browser to register your consent:

Flu can be an unpleasant illness and can cause serious complications. Vaccinating your child will help to protect them from getting the flu and prevent it spreading among more vulnerable family and friends. Even if your child had it last year, the type of flu can vary each winter, so it is recommended to have the flu vaccine again this year or they won't be protected.



Snack Time

Children in Years 3-6 are encouraged to bring a piece of fruit or raw vegetables into school to have as a morning snack. This is because many children find it hard to make it to lunchtime without getting hungry, which effects their concentration and learning behaviour. Only fruit and vegetables are allowed in school for snack time. This is so that it can be taken outside, eaten on the carpet or eaten at their tables while they continue their learning.

Punctuality Matters

Thank you to parents/carers (and children) who have adjusted so well to our new start times across the federation. It is so important that children make a prompt and effective start to the day. We fully understand that a late arrival does sometimes happen due to unavoidable circumstances. Whenever possible, it is always better to inform the school by telephone when a child will be late.

Where a child has a pattern of late arrival, we will investigate causes and seek an improvement. A pattern of late arrivals after the registers have closed may lead to the school referring the family to the LA's Attendance and Welfare Officer for investigation.

Rights Respecting Article Of The Week

Article 38 (war and armed conflicts)

Governments must not allow children under the age of 15 to take part in war or join the armed forces. Governments must do everything they can to protect and care for children affected by war and armed conflict.

Article 39 (recovery from trauma and reintegration)

Children who have experienced neglect, abuse, exploitation, torture or who are victims of war must receive special support to help them recover their health, dignity, self-respect and social life.

The International Day of Peace("Peace Day") is observed around the world each year on 21st September. Peace Day provides a globally shared date for all humanity to commit to peace above all differences and to contribute to building a culture of peace.

What does **peace** mean to you?

At Brindishe Schools, we discuss with our children in a sensitive way, how it might feel to living through conflict and war. We discuss peace and conflict around the world and how we might be good 'Peacemakers' in our own lives.







Online Safety Bulletin

Back to school photos - Are you a 'sharent'?

With the excitement of a new school year and your child reaching a new milestone, many of us share photos of our child online without thinking about the associated risks. If you post online, then try following these basic rules:

- Don't post any photos of your child that show their school logo/name or recognisable places by where they live that can make it easy for people to find out their location.
- Never include your child's full name.
- Are there any other children in the pictures you share online? If yes, do you have permission from their parent/carer to upload it?
- Would your child be happy for your comment/photo about them to be online remember what might be 'cute' now may be embarrassing to them in the future.
- Make sure appropriate privacy settings are on.

Alternatively, you could just share photos with those who you really want to share the photo with (grandparents etc.) via WhatsApp or iMessage rather than via social media.
