# Mini-Egg Hazards

Little signs of Spring are popping up all over the place... daffodils, Easter bonnets, baskets and yes, Mini Eggs!

Experts are once again reminding us, not to let young children have small Easter eggs like Mini Eggs because they're a choking hazard, particularly younger children.

Cadbury / Nestle put a warning on the packaging of their mini eggs that they are a choking hazard and should not be given to the under 4's. This will apply to many other brands as well. Solid chocolate eggs pose a choking risk to children - they're very similar in shape and size to grapes.

If you are going to give these eggs to your children as a treat, they should be cut in half which will make them easier to swallow. Please remember children, particularly younger children should be supervised when eating these eggs and should be seated and not running around.



## Rights Respecting at Brindishe Schools – Article of the week

Article 18 (parental responsibilities and state assistance): Both parents (or legal guardians) share responsibility for bringing up their child and parents and carers should always consider what is best for the child. Governments must support parents and legal carers by creating support services for children and giving parents the help they need to raise their children.

Article 5 (parental guidance and a child's evolving capacities): Governments must respect the rights and responsibilities of parents and carers to provide guidance and direction to their child as they grow up, so that they fully enjoy their rights. This must be done in a way that recognises the child's increasing capacity to make their own choices.

Articles 5 and 18 are all about the job of parents and carers in the upbringing of children and young people.

What are some of the important things that carers and parents do for children?

- Provide you with a home.
- Care for you and show you love.
- Provide food and clothes.
- Set you a good example.
- Help you to become independent.
- Give you emotional support.
- Support your learning and going to school.
- Make sure you have opportunities to be fit and healthy.
- Prepare you for adult life.
- Share their culture and identity and beliefs and values with you.
- Allow you to be yourself.
- Help you to enjoy all of your rights!



Parents and carers have a right to support from the government to help them bring up their children. Governments often provide this help through the council or through charities. Home Start is one example of charity support for families.

# Brindishe Weekly Online Safety Bulletin

## Is YouTube safe?

#### Do you know your child's favourite YouTuber?

So many children love the miniseries, vlogs and updates available on YouTube, but it is recommended by YouTube that children access its content through YouTube Kids. The suggested age restriction for accessing media on this site is 4+.

The site uses algorithms to filter content from its mother site, however, as this is done digitally rather than manually, sometimes inappropriate content and targeted adverts can still sometimes slip through. The app also gives you the option to limit search functions and restrict it to videos and channels you would like them to see.

The NSPCC have produced this article discussing the risks associated with using YouTube and the safety settings and features that are available depending on how old your child is and what they do on YouTube.

## Easter Holiday Vouchers

We can now confirm that London Borough of Lewisham will use a further allocation of the 'Household Support Fund' to support families with FSM eligible children by providing vouchers for the holidays this year (23/24) and in particular, the upcoming Easter Holidays. The available funding means Lewisham can assist these families at a rate of £30 per eligible child for Easter. There will not be an additional allocation made to cover inset days or other closures.
