Dear Parents, Carers, Friends and Colleagues,

I hope that everyone enjoyed a restful summer. I am pleased that the new term has started so well in our two schools. Now that the federation is formally established our new website

This week Lewisham published the results of each schools' performance in national tests in summer 2010. I know you will all be pleased to see that both schools in the federation have done extremely well again this year.

Brindishe Lee is once again the highest performing school in numbers of children who reach the national expectation in English and maths.

Brindishe Green results show the most progress and improvement in Lewisham– going from 49% reaching level 4 in both subjects in 2007 to 90% reaching level 4 in both subjects in 2010.

Sing Up!

Brindishe Lee is going for gold - in fact we are aiming to become a gold standard school for singing this year. Our plan, in conjunction with Brindishe Green, is to develop our singing skills on a daily basis - within each classroom, within key stages, across the whole school, across the federation, and across the wider school communities. We have made a pledge with the national group Sing Up (a Youth Music initiative at www.singup.org) to make singing an integral part of our daily learning at Brindishe. Singing is an aerobic activity that boosts oxygenation in the bloodstream, increasing mental alertness. Experts believe that the variety of skills needed for singing, including coordination

and listening, help develop the brain. Learning song lyrics can improve mental agility and reading skills. But the best thing about singing together is that it is great fun: as Howard Goodall, composer, and the government's singing ambassador, says, 'When children are singing they are taking in information and training the brain but they don't think they are, they think they are just having fun.' We want to gain the Sing Up Gold Award by the end of this academic year, and we very much hope that you will support your child through encouraging their singing, and perhaps by joining the...
