I am really looking forward to getting to know everyone at the school and beginning to understand what I can do to contribute to the continued recovery from the Covid-19 pandemic, ensuring that we continue to provide exceptional education for all our pupils into the future.

UPDATE FROM THE BRINDISHE GOVERNING BODY What an amazing community effort!

As we approach the final days of this academic year, it's important to reflect on the way that the whole Brindishe community - staff, parents, carers, volunteers, local groups, businesses and residents – have worked and contributed to keep the children learning and achieving their very best in the most difficult of circumstances. On behalf of the Governing Body, I'd like to say a very heartfelt thank you to you all.

Not everything's been about the pandemic this year, and since summer 2020 governors and senior leaders have been working on a range of topics. **Here are just a few recent highlights**:

- *After much research, discussion and a little bit of tasting a new **school meals** provider has been selected and they will start in September. They're called Radish, and you'll be hearing lots about them as we hope you'll sign up for your children to try their dishes.
- *Brindishe Manor's nursery and reception children will be able to enjoy an **exciting new outside play and learning space** from the start of the new term. Their outside space has been due for an upgrade for a while, so it's wonderful to be able to approve this at last.
- * New link governors for Safeguarding, Health and Safety and Special Needs were appointed during the past year and have visited each school to make sure that our buildings are in a good and healthy condition, and that our **children are safe**. Link governors have also recently been appointed to the **individual schools** to work closely with the Headteacher and senior leaders, and advance the sense of individuality where appropriate to all governors.
- *A major focus for the governing body this year has been to **recruit new governors** to fill several vacancies. It's important to get the right people with the right skills so that we can work effectively and efficiently. I'm pleased to say that we've been successful in recruiting Carolyn Unsted and Andrew Fiddy, both very experienced and skillful, and you can read more about them shortly on the Governors page of your school website, together with pieces about the existing current governors. Our focus from September will be filling the remaining vacancies with governors who will help the GB better **reflect our diverse community**. If you know of someone who might be interested and is not currently a Brindishe parent or member of staff, do please let us know.
- *Finally, we're hoping that from September all full GB meetings will able to be held in person, which means we can **welcome back observers.** So if you would like to come along to see what goes on, please email rwaite@brindisheschools.org. The next meeting will be on Wednesday October 6th at 6pm. If you're unable to attend, the minutes of each full GB meeting are available on request at your school office.

Start and End of Day

At the time of writing this newsletter, the following procedures for the start and end of the day will be in place from September. If guidance changes before September, we will update you further.

Start of Day

The school gates will open at 8.45am and close at 9am. All children will be expected in school before 9am when the gates shut. We will continue to use the one-way system for parents/carers and ask you to walk through the playground and out via the carpark gate.

End of Day

All children in Years 1-6 will come out to the playground at 3.15pm. All parents/carers will enter through the main gates to pick up and exit via the school car park gate.

Reception and Nursery children will continue be collected from their classroom doors via the Early Years outdoor learning area and parents/carers will be asked to exit through the car park and come back in to the main playground to collect children from Yr 1-6.

Nursery AM collection and **PM** arrival will continue to be via the Car Park entrance.

PCR testing

If you or your child is showing any symptoms of COVID-19, you must isolate as a family and book a PCR test on the following website: https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test

WHEN SHOULD I HAVE A PCR TEST?

- **If you currently have symptoms** that may indicate COVID-19, this is the test you should have to diagnose the infection.
- If a lateral flow test is positive. The purpose of the PCR test is to confirm the diagnosis, since it is a more accurate test than the lateral flow test.

WHEN SHOULD I HAVE A LATERAL FLOW TEST?

• You should only have this test **if you don't have any symptoms** and have been invited to take one as part of an exercise to identify infected people without symptoms.

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
